



SUBSIDIZED PASSES FOR LOW-INCOME TRANSIT (SPLIT)

ABOUT THE SPLIT PROGRAM

The SPLIT program offers eligible low-income Halton residents with a subsidy for part of their local travel expenses.

ELIGIBILITY AND DOCUMENTS NEEDED TO APPLY

The following individuals may qualify for the SPLIT program:

- students, adults or seniors living with a low income in Halton
- individuals receiving assistance from Ontario Works or the Ontario Disability Support program
- government and privately sponsored refugees
- registered ActiVan or Taxi Scrip Program users with a low income living in Halton Hills

Eligibility is assessed annually.

DOCUMENTS NEEDED TO APPLY

When you submit your application, you will be asked for personal information and proof of income. For proof of income, you will need a **Notice of Assessment (NOA)**, which is provided by the Canadian Revenue Agency (CRA). If you do not have your most recent NOA, you can obtain a copy thru **CRA My Account**.

A copy of your NOA must be received within 10 business days of submitting your application. Applications with missing documentation are considered incomplete and will be closed after 10 business days. If you will not be able to submit the documents within 10 business days, wait and apply when your documents are ready.

AFTER YOU APPLY & WHERE TO GET SPLIT PASSES

Once your application is submitted, staff from Halton Region will contact you and advise if any additional information is needed. Staff will let you know if you qualify. Once you qualify, you can get your bus pass at the Burlington Transit downtown bus terminal located at 430 John St., Burlington.
