> ONTARIO DRUG BENEFIT PROGRAM (ODB)

# WHAT IS IT

Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB) program covers most of the cost of prescriptions drug products listed in the Formulary.

## WHO IS IT FOR?

Individuals who meet any ONE of the following criteria:

- 65 years old
- · living in a
  - long-term care home
  - home for special care
  - Community Home for Opportunity
- · 24 years of age or younger and not covered by a private insurance plan
- · receiving professional home and community care services
- · receiving benefits from Ontario Works or Ontario Disability Support Program
- enrolled in the <u>Trillium Drug Program</u> (for those not described above, who do not have a private insurance plan that covers 100% of their drugs and who spend about 4% or more of their aftertax household income on prescriptions drugs)

# WHAT'S COVERED?

- approximately 5,000 prescription drug products, some prescribed over-the-counter drugs
- Exceptional Access Program (EAP) (requests made for coverage of drug products not listed in the Formulary)
- It also helps pay for:
  - allergy shots and epinephrine injectable products (used in response to severe allergic reaction)
  - · some products used in monitoring and testing for diabetes
  - some prescribed over-the-counter drugs under specific circumstances (for example, Ibuprofen 200mg, Ferrous sulphate 300)
  - some nutrition products
  - · some drugs used in the treatment of HIV/AIDS
  - · some drugs used in palliative care
  - · help to quit smoking:
    - up to a year of pharmacist-assisted counselling (talk to your pharmacist or health care provider)
    - drugs for treatment if you are age 18 years or older

### HOW TO APPLY FOR THE ONTARIO DRUG BENEFIT PROGRAM

- Seniors are automatically enrolled effective the first month after their 65<sup>th</sup> birthday; the government should send a letter approximately 3 months prior
- Children 24 years-of-age or under are automatically enrolled provided they are not covered by a private plan
- Those living in long-term care homes, homes for special care or community homes are automatically covered
- Those receiving <u>ODSP</u> or <u>OW</u> are automatically covered
- Application for the <u>Trillium Drug Program</u> must be completed by September 30<sup>th</sup> each year

  - Once you are enrolled, you will receive a confirmation letter telling you what your deductible is for the year.
  - Your household's enrollment **will be renewed automatically every year** and you will receive an annual confirmation letter.

### WHAT DO I PAY?

Co-payments and/or deductibles apply for most categories of recipients. These amounts are generally based on income. The benefit year runs from August 1 thru July 31.

#### **ODBCOPAYS**

There are NO deductibles and a \$2 co-pay per prescription for:

- Single seniors with income <= \$22,200
- Senior couples with combined income <=\$37,100</li>
- Individuals living in LT care, special care and community homes
- Individuals receiving ODSP and OW

### Exceptional Access Program

May assist in paying for a drug that's not currently covered by the Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB).

As a first step to getting this help, you and your doctor or nurse practitioner can do a search to make sure the drug you need is covered through the Exceptional Access Program.

Your doctor or nurse practitioner fills out and submits <u>the application</u> for you. Only a doctor or nurse practitioner can apply for coverage through the Exceptional Access Program or Compassionate Review Policy.

There is no deadline for these applications.

Applications are considered according to:

- the type of drug needed
- the severity or rarity of the illness or medical condition
